**Absence During WA**

Students should submit their Medical Certificate(s) if they are ill and unable to sit for any paper(s) when they return to school.

Only Medical Certificates issued by a medical practitioner registered under the Medical Registration Act will be accepted.

For absences due to official events like competitions, SYF — VR is given only if students cannot be present during the paper itself. If they are in school at the time of the paper, they are required to sit for it.
