

What is PFP?

- One-year programme
- Practice-oriented curriculum
- Prepare students for entry into the relevant 3-year Polytechnic Diploma courses
- Offered by all 5 Polytechnics















PFP – Eligibility Criteria

- ELMAB3 -English, Mathematics, Best 3 Subjects
 - Raw aggregate score of 12 points or better (excluding CCA bonus points)

What is DPP?

- 2-Year Higher Nitec with 10 weeks Preparatory Course at Institute of Technical Education (ITE)
- For students who would like to benefit from a more hands-on preparation at ITE
- DPP student is assured of a place in a related polytechnic course, provided she achieves the qualifying GPA in the 2-year Higher Nitec course.

Regular Attendance

- Parents may call the General Office at 6489 7580 in the event of an emergency.






Zero Tolerance on Bullying

- As such, our school will <u>not</u> tolerate any unlawful or disruptive behaviour, including any form of bullying, cyber-bullying, intimidation or retaliation.






