






F. Student Engagement – 3 Ps of Relating with One Another

Polite	Be mindful of what is said and how (the tone) it is being said
Positive	 Address the issue and not the person Do not spread rumours Speak responsibly Respect confidentiality
Perspectives	Do not jump to conclusionsListen & understand the other first

FCE/D&T	15% for Two WAs within the Semester 70% for Coursework to be submitted at the end of Semester

- Examples of WA include: Class Test, Project, Journal

D. Curriculum & Assessment – Promotion Criteria

Stream	Promotion Criteria	If student does not meet promotion criteria, she will be
1Exp	Pass in EL & a pass in overall percentage (50% or more) in the average for all subjects	Laterally transferred to 2N(A)
1N(A)	Grade 5 or better in a) EL and 2 other subjects or b) 4 subjects	Retained at Sec 1N(A)
1N(T)	Grade D or better in 2 subjects, one of which should be EL or Mathematics	Retained at Sec 1N(T)





D. Curriculum & Assessment

Criteria for Lateral Transfer for 1N(A) to 2Exp

A student will be considered for Lateral Transfer to Sec 2 Express if she obtained:

- a Grade 5 or better in EL and 2 other subjects or a pass percentage in 4 subjects
- and 70% or higher in the average of all subjects combined





D. Curriculum & Assessment

Criteria for Lateral Transfer for 1N(T) to 2N(A)

A student will be considered for Laterally transfer to Sec 2 Normal (Academic) if she obtained:

- an average score of 70% or higher of all N(T) subjects at the year-end examinations, and
- deemed able to cope with the N(A) course.





D. Curriculum & Assessment - Homework

Period	Load
During School Term	Sec 1,2: Up to 15 hrs per week; 2 hrs per day Sec 3-5: Up to 18 hrs per week; 2.5 hrs per day [e.g. Sec 3-5: 2 hours per subject per week]
School Holidays	Daily homework load should not be more than 50% of the daily load given during the school week

Homework is meant for students to:

- Consolidate and apply the skills and knowledge learnt in the classroom
- Receive timely feedback
- Develop good study habits and promote self-directed learning and strengthen studying skills





D. Curriculum & Assessment – Subject Based Banding

Subject Based Banding (SBB) allows students in the N(A) and N(T) courses the flexibility to take individual subjects at a more demanding level from Secondary 1 based on their subject-specific strengths demonstrated at the PSLE. Parents will receive the offer letter If their daughter met the eligibility criteria

• English, Mother Tongue Languages, Mathematics and Science

Beyond the start of Secondary 1, students may also offer subjects at a more demanding level based on their performance in secondary school. Parents of these students will be informed about the offer.



- 4. Different environment with new people
- 5. Greater peer influence and independence







4. Transition to Secondary School





Communicate like a parent and a friend

Show interest in their friendships, thoughts, and feelings, and listen without judgement.



Acknowledge that their friends may matter more than before

Understand that their friends' opinions may be very important to them at this age.



Respect their personal space to learn and grow

Allow them to develop their identity, manage their emotions, and handle challenges responsibly by themselves.



Eat meals together regularly to check in with one another

Try some conversation starters such as "What did you enjoy doing today?" or "What are you looking forward to in school tomorrow?"
