

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



Polite	<ul> <li>Be mindful of what is said and how (the tone) it is being said</li> </ul>
Positive	<ul> <li>Address the issue and not the person</li> </ul>
	Do not spread rumours
	Speak responsibly
	Respect confidentiality
Perspectives	Do not jump to conclusions
	<ul> <li>Listen &amp; understand the other first</li> </ul>

- Overall Average based on level ranking
- Relevant subjects: subject overall mark
- Preference: 1<sup>st</sup> Choice > 2<sup>nd</sup> choice > ...
- Availability of resources

#### **D. Curriculum & Assessment - Homework**

Homework is meant for students to:

- Consolidate and apply the skills and knowledge learnt in the classroom
- Receive timely feedback
- Develop good study habits and promote self-directed learning and strengthen studying skills





#### **E. Promotion Criteria**

Stream	Promotion Criteria	If student does not meet promotion criteria, she will be
2Exp	Pass in EL & a pass in overall percentage (50% or more) in the average for all subjects	Laterally transferred to 3N(A)
2N(A)	Grade 5 or better in a) EL and 2 other subjects or b) 4 subjects	Retained at Sec 2N(A)
	Grade D or better in 2 subjects, one of which should be EL or Mathematics	Retained at Sec 2N(T)





#### Criteria for Lateral Transfer for 2N(A) to 3Exp

- A student will be considered for Lateral Transfer to Sec 3 Express if she obtained:
- a Grade 5 or better in EL and 2 other subjects OR
- a pass percentage in 4 subjects **and** 70% or higher in the average of all subjects





### Criteria for Lateral Transfer for 2N(T) to 2N(A)

A student will be considered for Lateral Transfer to Sec 2 Normal (Academic) if she obtained:

- an average score of 70% or higher of all N(T) subjects at the year-end examinations, and
- deemed able to cope with the N(A) course.

Co-Curricular Attainment	Details	
Excellent (2 bonus points)	Student who attains a minimum Level 3 in all four domains with at least a Level 4 in one domain.	
Good (1 bonus point)	<ul> <li>Student who attains a minimum Level 1 in all four domains with any one of the following: <ol> <li>At least Level 2 in three domains;</li> <li>At least Level 2 in one domain and at least Level 3 in another domain; or</li> <li>At least Level 4 in one domain.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>	
Fair	Student's attainment in co-curricular will not translate into any bonus points.

## **5. Support for Student Well-being**



Communicate like a parent and a friend

Show interest in their friendships, thoughts, and feelings, and listen without judgement.

Acknowledge that their friends may matter more than before

Understand that their friends' opinions may be very important to them at this age.

Respect their personal space to learn and grow

Allow them to develop their identity, manage their emotions, and handle challenges responsibly by themselves.



Eat meals together regularly to check in with one another

Try some conversation starters such as "What did you enjoy doing today?" or "What are you looking forward to in school tomorrow?"
